

Malaysian Airline System (MAS) - Boeing 777-200ER

Date of Loss: 7th March 2014

A Malaysian Airline System Boeing 777-200ER aircraft, registration 9M-MRO, which was performing a flight from Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia) to Beijing (China) with 227 passengers and 12 crew on board has been reported missing.

According to reports the aircraft was enroute at 35,000 feet about 40 minutes into the flight about 90 nautical miles northeast of Kota Bharu (Malaysia) over the Gulf of Thailand when radar and radio contact was lost at about 01:22 local time .

At the time of writing (10th March) no trace of the aircraft or any wreckage has been discovered and it is assumed that the aircraft has crashed into the sea as it would have run out of fuel. There have been no reports of the aircraft landing at any airport in the region.

The airline has confirmed on their website the aircraft is missing and that a search and rescue operation has been initiated .

In a press conference the airline confirmed that the aircraft was carrying 154 Chinese citizens, 38 Malaysians, 7 Indonesians, 6 Australians, 5 Indian, 4 French, 3 citizens of USA, 2 New Zealanders, 2 Ukrainians, 2 Canadians, 1 Russian, 1 Italian, 1 Dutch and 1 Austrian.
